Marine Corps League Women's History Month



The Corps has always been fertile soil for firsts throughout our nation's history, and the promotion of Carol A. Mutter to become the nation's first female lieutenant general serves as a perfect case in point for Women's History Month.

Mutter achieved one-star brigadier general rank in 1991. Three years later Mutter became the first woman in the history of America's military to achieve two-star major general rank in 1994, and two years after that in 1996 she became the first woman to become a three-star lieutenant general in any American military branch. Born in 1945 in Greeley, Colorado, Mutter graduated in 1967 from officer candidate school at the University of Northern Colorado as a second lieutenant in the Marine Corps.

Mutter had a number of firsts during her 32-year career in the Corps:

- •First woman to qualify as Command Center Crew Commander/Space Director at U.S. Space Command.
- First woman of flag rank (general officer rank) to command a major deployable tactical command.
- First woman Marine major general, and senior woman in all the services at that time.
- First woman nominated by a U.S. president (Bill Clinton) for three-star rank.
- First female lieutenant general in the U.S. Armed Forces.

During a 2014 interview for the documentary Unsung Heroes: The Story of America's Female Patriots, Mutter explains why she joined the Marine Corps during the early years of the Vietnam War.

"Because they're the best, there's no doubt about that," she said. "...

when I joined, (the Corps) was only one percent female and there were no women in the deployed forces at all. So, as long as the women were back in the rear doing the jobs that the men didn't want to do, there was not much of a problem."

The general has been recognized as a trailblazer by several different organizations. Among them is the National Women's Hall of Fame which inducted the general in 2017. Mutter retired from the Corps in 1999 and lives with her husband at their home in Lookout Mountain, Tennessee.

From that position I hope to serve the Department as well as I have served this Detachment. I am a firm believer that in this life, regardless of age, we must all continuously move forward. Staying stagnant and complacent is not good for anyone. It is the destroyer of faith, knowledge, and body alike. Feed your faith, feed your knowledge, and feed your drive to improve the yourself. This is the secret to making this world a better place.

ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY PROGRAM AGREEMENT

The Adopt-A-Highway program has been established for community civic organizations as well as private businesses and industry to contribute toward the effort of maintaining cleaner and more beautiful roadsides. The North Carolina Department of Transportation and MCL (Marine Corps League) recognize the need and desirability of litter-free and visually-improved highways.

The North Carolina Department of Transportation recognizes the above namedentity as the adopting organization for: Roadway Name and Number SR1300 (Kildaire Farm Rd SR 1300 from Holly Springs Rd to Ten-Ten Rd)

The above-named entity volunteers to pick up litter once every three months (or more if necessary) for four years along its section of highway and promote a better environment in the community. This agreement shall be valid for four years beginning 02/25/2019, and ending 02/25/2023. The entity may cancel this agreement upon 30 days written notice to the North Carolina Department of Transportation.

The individual participants agree to not hold the department responsible for any injuries they, their employees or their agents may suffer or damages that they, their employees, or their agents may cause or suffer as a result of participation in the program and have agreed that signs bearing the group's name shall be installed solely at the discretion of the department.


